#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

The English as an Additional Language Learners' program is aligned to the Common Core State Standards and provides focused instruction that will accelerate academic language proficiency and language skills to ensure academic success.

**Reach Higher 2A and 2B by National Geographic Learning** focuses on the development of language proficiency and academic knowledge to ensure academic success for all students who are newcomers to English. It provides explicit, intensive, and rigorous instruction that accelerates the students' development of English language skills as well as develop transferable academic skills.

The units include science and social studies text, and authentic literature which provide the students with a global perspective. The Big Question in each unit requires the students to think critically about the content. Each reading includes background building, vocabulary building, a reading strategy and activities for comprehension, grammar, and writing. Critical vocabulary and key terms are taught before reading with multiple opportunities to practice. Reading strategies are taught in a step- by - step format to ensure students know when and how to apply the strategies to their own reading. Phonics instruction and practice helps students to develop reading fluency. Modelled writing activities give students guided practice in key writing skills. Students participate in language development activities which involve presenting a song, poem or story, conducting research and reporting on a topic. As the students engage with the content, they develop the critical-thinking, problem-solving, and analytical skills needed to succeed in their academic studies.

To further support students in developing their reading fluency and comprehension, students will use **Reading A-Z** <a href="https://www.raz-plus.com">https://www.raz-plus.com</a>. This is a digital, interactive, personalized reading program that includes leveled eBooks spanning 29 levels of reading difficulty. There is a wide variety of both fiction and non-fiction content, which students can choose from based on their interest and assessed level of reading. This is to be facilitated in class with further reading being assigned out of class.

**Reader's Theater** further promotes and supports reading fluency as students practice reading aloud with expression to build their reading confidence. Students read aloud selected parts in scripts written for them or written by the students themselves. Students then demonstrate their fluency when they present their scripts to an audience at the end of the school year.

#### **COURSE OBJECTIVES:**

- Structured vocabulary building, reading, comprehension, grammar, and writing activities will develop students' confidence and proficiency in accordance with the Common Core State Standards.
- 2. Develop transferable academic skills so that students succeed in mainstream classes.
- 3. Develop communication, collaboration, critical thinking, and problem-solving skills as well encourage creative thinking skills.
- 4. Encourage self-directed learning within a safe and supportive environment.

#### **ASSESSMENT:**

Students will be continuously assessed throughout the units of work to inform their learning. The assessment will provide students with timely corrective feedback to ensure that students meet the lesson objectives as set out by the Common Core State Standards.

Students' participation in class is extremely important and will form part of their deportment grade. Homework tasks will also be used for assessment.

Students will take a reading test after completing a reading in the unit, and a unit exam or project will be used for assessment at the end of each quarter. Quarter exams are administered four times a year. Grades are weighted according to the Dominican International School grading policy found in the Student Handbook.
