COURSE DESCRIPTION:

From learning the art of basic conducting to analyzing complex musical scores, from refining individual and group performance skills to crafting creative arrangements, students will engage with music on multiple levels. COURSE OBJECTIVES:

Students will:

- 1. Develop fundamental conducting skills, including clear beat patterns, cues, and expressive gestures, enabling effective communication with musicians.
- 2. Apply score reading skills to inform conducting decisions, enhancing the conductor's ability to communicate the composer's vision.
- 3. Participate in solo and ensemble assessments, receiving constructive feedback from peers and instructors to facilitate growth and improvement.
- 4. Apply critical listening skills to evaluate performances, recognizing strengths and areas for refinement in both individual and group contexts.
- 5. Collaborate with classmates to create and perform original musical arrangements, combining diverse instruments and voices creatively and compellingly.
