COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Building on the skills acquired in Grade 1, Grade 2 students will continue to expand their musical horizons. They will delve deeper into rhythmic patterns, melodic concepts, and basic music theory. With a focus on fostering creativity, students will continue developing their understanding of rhythm and melody while exploring basic music theory concepts such as time signatures and simple scales. Students will enhance their musical creativity and expression through group activities, creative movement, and basic music composition. This course encourages students to listen critically and collaborate effectively with peers.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

By the end of Grade 2 Music, students will be able to:

- 1. Create and perform more complex rhythms and melodic patterns using a variety of instruments and voices.
- 2. Identify and understand basic music theory concepts like time signatures and simple scales.
- 3. Collaborate with peers to create and perform simple compositions, demonstrating creativity and teamwork.
- 4. Explore diverse musical traditions and genres, recognizing cultural influences on music.
- 5. Deepen listening skills by identifying music dynamics, tempo changes, and expressive elements.
- 6. Demonstrate basic music reading skills by interpreting and performing simple melodies from notation.
