COURSE DESCRIPTION:

In Grade 3, students refine their musical abilities by reading and performing more complex rhythms and melodies. Creative expression flourishes as students compose their musical pieces, exploring various instrument families and experimenting with different sounds. The course introduces the element of harmony, where students harmonize melodies, further enhancing their vocal and instrumental skills. They engage in collaborative projects, creating compositions that showcase their creative talents. Cultural and historical connections are woven into the curriculum as students explore the classical musical style period. Through guided activities, students develop an acute ear for the intricacies of music and its role in society.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

By the end of Grade 3 Music, students will be able to:

- 1. Perform rhythmic and melodic patterns with increased precision, accuracy, and expressiveness.
- 2. Develop basic harmony skills by singing or playing in two-part ensembles and rounds.
- 3. Create original compositions with guidance, incorporating elements of melody and rhythm.
- 4. Analyze and discuss music from different cultures and historical periods, recognizing stylistic characteristics.
- 5. Participate confidently in group performances, demonstrating improved ensemble skills.
- 6. Engage in critical listening, identifying and describing musical forms and structures in various pieces.
