COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Grade 4 students will continue to refine their musical techniques and engage in more advanced musical concepts. They will explore harmony, dynamics, and expressive techniques, allowing them to convey emotions through their performances. Students will learn to perform with greater technical proficiency, infusing their playing with dynamics, articulation, and emotion. As such, music notation and reading skills will be refined, allowing students to perform simple pieces on instruments and sing more complex melodies. This course also aims to cultivate a broader appreciation for the diversity of musical traditions and expressions.

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COURSE OBJECTIVES:

By the end of Grade 4 Music, students will be able to:

- 1. Perform melodies and harmonies with greater technical skill and dynamic control.
- 2. Utilize more advanced music theory concepts, including intervals, dynamics, and articulation.
- 3. Collaborate in small ensembles to create and perform original compositions, demonstrating individual contributions within a group context.
- 4. Recognize musical notation and chord charts in playing the ukelele as a basic instrument.
- 5. Deepen critical listening skills by recognizing and evaluating musical elements in different genres.
