### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

In the Grade 5 Music course, students will embark on an exciting musical journey integrating creativity, theory, and practical skills. ### **COURSE OBJECTIVES:**

## By the end of the Grade 5 Music course, students will be able to:

- 1. Understand the basic elements of melodies, including pitch, rhythm, and dynamics, by analyzing and performing simple melodies on various instruments.
- 2. Examine a range of musical styles from different cultures and historical periods, discussing their characteristics and significance within their respective contexts.
- 3. Compose Melodies: Apply creative thinking to compose short melodic phrases using basic music notation, showcasing an understanding of rhythm and pitch relationships.
- 4. Gain hands-on experience with various instruments, such as the ukelele, recorders, xylophones, or hand percussion, to play melodies and simple accompaniments.
- 5. Develop active listening skills by analyzing and discussing musical pieces from diverse genres, identifying key elements, and expressing personal interpretations.
- 6. Interpret and read basic musical notation, including treble and bass clefs, notes, rests, and time signatures, enabling successful sight-reading.
- 7. Engage in group performances, ensemble activities, and small projects, fostering teamwork and enhancing musical communication skills.
- 8. Investigate the evolution of music through history, exploring significant composers, musicians, and their contributions to different musical eras.
- 9. Express Musical Interpretation: Interpret and express emotions within music by analyzing dynamics, tempo, articulation, and phrasing in selected musical pieces.
