COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Grade 8 Music course is a continuation class for music and exposes the students to how to perform and improve their skills solo or in a group. This course will focus on different rhythmic patterns and how to construct the major and minor scales. Through listening, lectures, classroom discussion, and other activities in class, the students will know how to perform the different types of rhythm and rhythmic patterns and memorize and construct the Major and Minor keys. The class will start with basic knowledge about rhythm and Time signatures.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

The students should be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate a clear understanding of key signatures, including major and minor keys, by correctly identifying and notating key signatures in various musical examples.
- 2. Interpret and perform music in different key signatures, vocally and instrumentally, displaying mastery over adjusting pitch based on the given key.
- 3. Compose rhythmic motifs and phrases using varied rhythmic subdivisions and patterns.
- 4. Apply knowledge of key signatures and rhythmic patterns to enhance live performances, improvisations, and interpretations of musical pieces.
- 5. Prepare and perform a solo or ensemble piece with confidence and artistic interpretation, incorporating appropriate stylistic elements.
