GRADE LEVEL: 12 SCHOOL YEAR: 2023-2024

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COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The craft of writing will be studied practically, with weekly writing exercises of various length, and constant review of writing and editing fundamentals, including sentence and paragraph structuring, editing for content, mechanics and grammar, etc. Students are required to submit weekly writing assignments, with a minimum of seven assessments* per quarter.

The ability to write well is acquired through the mastery of a great many individual skills. Through the teacher's guidance and insistence, students learn to carry over into all their writing the skills they have learned. The ability to write well requires, among other things, accurate observation, a stimulated imagination, strong interest in words, and an awareness of logical thinking and clear organization.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- IMPROVE scholarship by agreeing to engage the writing process with the requisite balance of desire, curiosity, and goal-oriented approach to self-improvement
- CONVINCE students that no matter how well they think they write, there is always room for improvement at the fundamental building-block level
- ENCOURAGE students to risk failing in order to have the opportunity to embrace the growth potential that arises from evaluating all efforts, especially unsuccessful ones
- INSPIRE students to exercise critical and independent thinking when participating in the course of their own education
- REWARD curiosity and courage by providing a growth-centered classroom setting that elevates every student who brings the energy to participate
- INTEREST students in the growth of their own creative imagination
