

Research Methods COURSE SYLLABUS

GRADE LEVEL: 11 SCHOOL YEAR: 2023-2024

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COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The research method course introduces academic research and the research writing process, aiming to equip students with the essential knowledge and skills to conduct effective research and engage in critical thinking. Students will explore aspects of conducting meaningful and evidence-based investigation across different academic disciplines. Additionally, students will learn to write a formal outline, as well as the subsections of a research paper: the introduction, literature review and methodology. They will also learn how to revise their papers, provide meaningful peer feedback, and use APA style to format, quote, cite research, and generate a list of references. By the end of the course, students will have acquired the necessary expertise to conduct reliable and effective research.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

In this course, students will learn how to:

- find sources and evaluate their credibility
- properly paraphrase and quote sources
- write an annotated bibliography
- develop and refine a thesis statement
- summarize and respond to counterarguments
- write a formal outline
- write the introduction, body and conclusion sections of a research paper
- use APA style to format, quote, cite research and write a reference section

ASSESSMENT:

Throughout the course, various forms of assessments are used. There will be seat work, quizzes, written assignments, in class discussions, projects/presentations and a quarterly exam

The quarterly grade will be awarded for all student work based on the following criteria:

- Homework, classwork, projects, discussions and other assignments 30% of quarterly grade
- Quizzes and tests 30% of quarterly grade

- Quarterly Exams 30% of quarterly grade
- Student conduct makes up 10% of the overall grade
- All assignments must be turned in on the day they are due. Penalties for late work are the following:
 - 1 day late = Minus 5%
 - 2 days late = Minus 10%
 - 3 days late = Minus 20%
 - 4 days late = Minus 60%
 - 5 days late or over = Project-I & Only 60%
