The 48th Annual East Asia Regional Council of Schools (EARCOS) Leadership Conference 2016

Dr. Mercia de Souza will be doing a presentation on 27 October at the EARCOS Leadership Conference in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. Her workshop will focus on the DIS GIN (Global Issues Network) activities, in particular the very successful GIN-SKY project for which the committee under her leadership raised money and sponsorships to bring twenty Africans from the Soweto Kliptown Youth in Johannesburg to Taiwan last year for cultural exchange for ten days. She will also talk about the significance of the Peace Pole that was replanted by GIN, the school's annual Hunger Banquet, that creates awareness about starvation worldwide, and Junior GIN which is a first in the world.

Sr. Socorro Teofilo, O.P., Sr. Rosa Dahbi, Ms Coney Catalan and Ms Janice Doyle will attend the conference as well. Apart from the regular conference workshops, they will also attend WASC workshops to update their accreditation knowledge. Sr. Socorro, Ms Coney and Sr. Rosa will go to the whole day pre-conference workshop for school administration members. Dr. Mercia and Ms Janice will attend the post-conference workshop for WASC Visiting Committee Members. Dr. Mercia has been on a school visit abroad as a Visiting Committee Member before, and Ms Janice hopes that she will have an opportunity in the near future to visit another school on behalf of the accreditation body. Ms Janice will attend workshops pertaining to alumni associations in schools, as she will be working closely with Sr. Zenaida to organize events involving the school's alumni during the 2017/18 Jubilee Year when DIS will celebrate the school's 60th anniversary.

Dr. Mercia (Chairperson of the school's Accreditation Steering Committee) will meet with Ms Barbara Parker, the school's WASC mentor to discuss the accreditation process.

Our Global Visitors



The Missionaries of Saint Dominic had occasion to meet in Taiwan at Beatitude Mountain in Kaohsiung.

The meeting was the Encounter of the General Curia, provincial Governments, Delegates and Economies of Provinces and Delegations. The Sisters came from Japan, Korea, the Philippines, Italy and Spain. Sr. Ma. Asuncion Gonzalez. O.P. the General Prioress of the Missionaries of St. Dominic, who is the leader of the Dominican Sisters worldwide, called the meeting in Taiwan, which she also attended.

Discussion topics were: strengthening the missionary dimension; strengthening the contemplative dimension; strengthening the fraternal dimension, and strengthening the prophetic dimension. The Dominican Sisters made a recommitment to their calling and the renewal of their mission. They confirmed that they would strengthen their sense of belonging and strengthen their leadership. Furthermore, they would have leadership devoted to the care of the person, which builds the community and makes it grow, and strengthens the sense of community belonging. The Sisters committed themselves to have the courage to break barriers in favour of renewal and flexible schedules, provide what is necessary and important, and fair treatment of every member of their community. Promotion of lively and creative liturgy in communities is also one of the objectives. Updating the topics of permanent formation is another commitment the Sisters made, as well as welcoming and integrating the laity in their spirituality and in the management of their work.

After the conference at Beatitude Mountain, the Sisters came to Taipei where they visited DIS and spent a day with the Dis Family. This lead to an early start to the St. Dominic's Day celebrations when the entire DIS faculty and staff joined the Dominican Sisters at the Grand Hotel to have lunch in the beautiful, traditional surroundings of the hotel. The DIS orchestra entertained the Sisters and the DIS community while they were having lunch and some of the sisters who have taught at DIS before could catch up with teachers they befriended during their time there. On Monday, 8 August, the DIS faculty and staff celebrated Mass, which concluded St. Dominic's Day.

Many teachers were delighted that Sr Margaret was well enough to join them for lunch. They were really grateful that all the prayers for her recovery were answered.

In 2016, the World Scholar's Cup opened another remarkable global round in Bangkok, Thailand. This year, we're proud to announce that three of the DIS scholars, Timmy Chang, Alec Chen and Cindy Su, qualified to attend the Tournament of Champions to be held at Yale University in November.

At the World Scholar's Cup, thousands of scholars gather together to celebrate the cuteness of the alpaca. "PWAA" is the sound a happy alpaca makes, while an angry alpaca spits. Alpacas are adorable, fluffy, four-legged creatures that should not be confused with llamas. However, that is only a tiny portion of the big, amazing, and magical experience.

Daniel Berdichevsky, founder and Alpaca-in-Chief, believes that the World Scholar's Cup is not a competition, but instead, a "celebration of learning", a gathering of nations, and a festival of scholars. Scholars from over 40 countries came together to debate, write essays, make friends, and share cultures.

The World Scholar's Cup provided us the most spectacular and exotic experiences. We witnessed the world's first tuktuk entry opening ceremony. We stormed through one of Bangkok's biggest malls just to complete tasks in the scavenger hunt. We even partied until I in the morning at the Scholar's Ball. People from all over the world came together at the Scholar's Fair to share their cultures. Yet, in between all this, there were several rigorous academic challenges. We faced several strong debaters from around the world and got to learn from their perspectives. By debating on current issues, we began to understand the world better. The Scholar's bowl challenged our team's cooperation and knowledge. The Scholar's Challenge tested us across six subject areas, from crime and justice to the history of cheating to disease and public health. Team Writing gave us an opportunity to debate and persuade through the art of language. The World Scholar's Cup connects not only world issues, but also scholars from different countries.

During the scholar's bowl, we received our very own fluffy alpacas. With those fluffy alpacas on our heads, we pledged the "hippopwaatic oath". In order to become the parents of those alpacas, we had to promise to "always feed our alpaca, dress our alpaca, and to never, ever, EAT our alpaca!" The alpacas are one of the most irreplaceable companions of our scholar's cup journey.

On the last day, the awards ceremony began with the flag march, honoring every country that's part of this community. We all had mixed feelings of nervousness (waiting for results), sadness (last day spent with the Scholar's Cup community), and happiness (indescribably incredible WSC experience). Three of the DIS scholars, Timmy Chang, Alec Chen and Cindy Su, will be going to the next round at Yale University in November.

Dominican Leadership: The Path towards Jubilation and Mercy

Sharing the fruits of one's contemplation is a famous Dominican way of extending the mission of Jesus particularly among the youth of today. On September 29, 2016, DIS was blessed to have Rev. Fr. Jeffrey Aytona, O.P. as facilitator for the Students and Parents Conference. The theme was inspired by the 800 year Jubilee celebration of the Order of Preachers and this year's Church universal call for Mercy.

Drawing from the words of Pope Francis during this year's World Youth Day, Dominicans were also reminded of these words, "All together, then, we ask the Lord: "Launch us on the adventure of mercy! Launch us on the adventure of building bridges and tearing down walls, barriers and barbed wire. Launch us on the adventure of helping the poor, those who feel lonely and abandoned, or no longer find meaning in their lives."

"The Lord does not keep his distance, but is near and real. He is in our midst and he takes care of us." During the conference, Fr. Jeff urged the STUCO (Student Council leaders), DYM (Dominican Youth Ministry Leaders), and DOMNET (Dominican Network) to be disciples of Jesus. With the series of reflective questions, Student leaders were able to draw inspiration from the assurance that as they travel as pilgrims, Jesus is their faithful companion. Fr. Jeff shed light also about the very importance of the Holy Mass as a summit of the Catholic way of thanking and worshipping the Lord.

The following day, a talk by Fr. Jeff, initiated by the VIP's (Volunteer Involved Parents), did some reflective sharing with the parents about their very significant roles in developing their children holistically.
