Robotics at DIS

During the past school year, a Robotics course was introduced to the Grade 7 students during their ICT classes. Incorporating a robotics course in ICT classes is an innovation.

This advancement in the field of ICT is supported by the Dominican Sisters led by the Directress/Principal, Sr. Ma. Zenaida Ancheta, O.P. This will help students create new ideas. Studying robotics is simpler to understand and a more tangible introduction to programming. When students program physical electronic connections, it is easier for them to see what goes wrong as they learn what it can and cannot do. They learn the skills needed to create precise and accurate instructions and have fun while learning valuable lessons. Learning robotics gives students the opportunity to address the growing demand for learning STEM subjects and how these subjects work and interact together. Robotics is a production-based learning module. Students have the opportunity to create something tangible and make it perform the actions that they program it to do. It combines creativity with engineering and technology. Grade seven students think it is cool, their engagement levels increase and they retain more information. If given the right information and tools these students can create a lot.

Learning robotics with Arduino will give the students the basics that they can use later to build larger robotics projects. The programming language used for Arduino is a language called C. This program teaches students to understand the basics of the C language. The word "Arduino" could mean three things: a physical piece of hardware, a programming environment, or a community and philosophy.

As hardware Arduino is a microcontroller platform that has captured the imagination of electronics enthusiasts. It allows every user to connect electronics through its pins so that it can control things. Examples of which are, turn lights/motors on and off or sense things such as light and temperature. Arduino is sometimes called physical computing. A microcontroller is a little computer on a chip. It has everything and more than the first home computers had. It has a processor, a random access memory (RAM) for holding data, an erasable programmable read-only memory (EPROM) for holding data and it has input and output pins. These input/output pins link the microcontroller to the rest of the electronics. Inputs can read both digital and analog. This opens up the opportunity of connecting many different types of sensors for light, temperature, and sound. Arduino boards run on 5 Volts voltage. It can be powered by a DC power socket, battery, or through a USB port. The Arduino family consists of several Arduino boards that are all programmed using the same language and have the same connections to the outside world. To name a few -Arduino Uno and Arduino Leonardo.

As a programming environment a sketch is a program

written with the Arduino IDE. It is best to think of a program - or a sketch, as programs are called in Arduino - as a list of instructions to be carried out in the order that they are written down. After writing sketches, press the "compile" button to check for possible errors. Press the "Upload" button to program Arduino board with your sketch. The most commonly used is the "Blink" sketch. Sketches are stored on the development computer as text files with the extension name .ino. As a community and philosophy, it is an open source nature that makes it a great choice for anyone wanting to build electronic projects. Open source community is diverse. Opensource software and other collective projects benefit through, and because of, community. Most of the technology world is familiar with open source software and it is more attractive than proprietary software. It can be examined for security flaws, altered to suit wishes, or used as the basis for a new

product. Just like other open source software, people can and

do make derivatives of Arduino boards or entirely new

products powered by Arduino technology.






Teachers vs Students
