GRADE LEVEL: 5 SCHOOL YEAR: 2022-2023

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COURSE DESCRIPTION:

In this beginner-intermediate Chinese as a second language course class is focus on having students master acquisition of the build up their vocabulary and repertoire of sentence patterns.
