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COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Welcome to The World's Religions course!

Understanding the basics of world religions in a multicultural and global world is a must. The students will learn how to respect different religions' set of beliefs and to understand properly the worldviews they shape without prejudice and bias. This will help them to recognize the diversity of the human world and culture as a positive yet challenging characteristic. Interviewing people of different religions and connecting religion with other subjects will help the students to build a positive relationship toward people and the various academic and social fields. Reading and commenting on newspaper articles related to world religions is one of the routine exercises at this level.

Teaching Strategies

Classroom interaction is emphasized. Instead of one-way teaching, students will do some research on Religion related to other academic subjects. Group discussion will sometimes be organized; students will be required to interview people of different religions. Students will be encouraged to discover the richness of the meaning of life. Students will have the opportunity to present and explain her/his idea to their classmates through discussions.
