#### COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Our Kindergarten Language Arts program, aligned with the California Common Core State Standards, provides a strong foundation for literacy through engaging phonics instruction, storybooks, and meaningful classroom interactions. This nurturing environment promotes the development of early reading, speaking, and listening skills, enabling children to express their ideas with confidence and accuracy.

We emphasize clear verbal communication and encourage children to use complete sentences, laying the groundwork for the more structured language skills of Grade 1. Early writing is introduced through the use of lined notebooks and personal chalkboards, supporting children as they begin to form letters and simple sentences.

Our multi-sensory approach engages all learning styles, ensuring that each child is fully supported in their developmental journey. Through a combination of structured learning and playful exploration, we prepare children to smoothly transition to the academic demands of first grade, building both foundational skills and a love for language that will last a lifetime.

**COURSE OBJECTIVES:** By the end of the semester/school year, (SWAT) Students will be able to:

#### Reading

Students will develop foundational reading skills to build early literacy and comprehension. By the end of Kindergarten, students will be able to:

- Recognize concepts of print, including reading left to right, top to bottom, and page order.
- Demonstrate phonological awareness, including rhyming, syllables, and isolating beginning, middle, and ending sounds.
- Know all upper- and lowercase letters and their most common sound associations.
- Apply basic phonics skills to decode simple words and recognize common high-frequency sight words.

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- Actively participate in group reading of stories and informational texts with understanding and purpose.
- Ask and answer questions about key details, characters, settings, and major events in a story.
- Identify the **main topic** and supporting details in simple informational texts.

#### Writing

Students will begin to express their thoughts and ideas through writing, using drawings, dictation, and written words. By the end of Kindergarten, students will be able to:

- Compose **opinion pieces** by stating a preference and supporting it with a reason.
- Create informative/explanatory texts to name a topic and provide related facts.
- Narrate **personal or imaginary stories**, sequencing events and providing a reaction or ending.
- Use basic **conventions of standard English**, such as beginning sentences with capital letters and ending them with punctuation.
- Print many uppercase and lowercase letters legibly.

# Speaking & Listening

Students will strengthen oral language and listening skills to become effective communicators. By the end of Kindergarten, students will be able to:

- Engage in collaborative conversations, following rules such as listening to others and taking turns speaking.
- Ask and answer questions to seek help, gain information, or clarify something not understood.
- Describe familiar people, places, things, and events with relevant details.
- 1. Speak audibly and express thoughts, feelings, and ideas clearly.word, and include an ending period. (W.K.3, L.K.2.A–B)
