

COURSE DESCRIPTION:



Religious Studies is a God-centered program that aims to develop students' integral formation, transforming them into valuable and constructive members of society. By integrating the Dominican ideals of love of study, prayer, community, and service to others, this subject empowers students to become critical thinkers, responsible decision-makers and stewards of God's creation, and reflective individuals who uphold Christian and universal values.

Third graders will embark on an exciting journey to understand and practice the D'TORCH Values and the Dominican, Universal, and Gospel values. They will explore these values through the lens of Jesus Christ's life and the loving examples of St. Dominic de Guzman, blessed and saints, and their mission of preaching the Truth (the Veritas).

The course is divided into five units:

- **Unit 1 The Church Is One:** Students learn that our shared faith in Jesus Christ and the Sacraments unite us as a community.
- Unit 2 The Church Is Holy: Through the Gospels, students encounter Jesus's work and learn to reflect God's love and likeness in their own lives.
- **Unit 3 The Church Is Catholic:** This unit explores the concept of God as the Father of all, emphasizing that the Church is a welcoming home for everyone.
- Unit 4 The Church Is Apostolic: Students will trace the Church's 2,000-year history, discovering how it remains faithful to the original teachings of the Apostles, who were taught by Jesus himself.
- Unit 5 The Church Has a Mission to the World: This final unit focuses on the Catholic Church's role as a sign of justice and peace, both in this world and the next.

COURSE OBJECTIVES AND CONTENTS:

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to (SWBAT):

• Knowledge (Word):

- Articulate the fundamental tenets of Catholic tradition and a common language of faith.
- Describe the lives of key Dominican saints, as well as the ethos and traditions of the Dominican order.

Action (Witness):

- Apply the Gospel message of Christian love, peace, and social justice in age-appropriate ways.
- Assess their actions in light of the D'TORCH values, using specific indicators for practical application.

• Practice (Worship):

- Participate meaningfully in Catholic worship, including the Holy Mass, by understanding and engaging in liturgical prayer, songs, and rituals.
- Utilize a variety of prayer forms, such as traditional, meditative, and Dominican prayers, as well as prayer through music, art, and ritual actions.
- Recognize the importance of the saints and practice seeking their intercession.
