COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This Social Studies course is designed to ensure the students understand the cultural exchange and histories of the regions of the western hemisphere in a geopolitical sense. After taking this course students will be able to read, understand, use research methods, and identify through primary and secondary sources the histories of the Americas, as well as name important characters, places, and events that helped create the trade networks and cultural exchanges that make this region the economic powerhouse it is today. Students will also familiarize themselves with the academic vocabulary necessary to understand and discuss social studies.

COURSE OBJECTIVES: By the end of the semester/school year, (SWBAT) Students will be able to:

- Determine the central ideas or information of a primary or secondary source; provide an accurate summary of the source distinct from prior knowledge or opinions.
- Identify key steps in a text's description of a process related to history/social studies
- Describe how a text presents information
- Distinguish among fact, opinion, and reasoned judgment in a text.
- Read and comprehend history/social studies texts in the grades 6-8 text complexity band independently and proficiently.
- Cite specific textual evidence to support analysis of primary and secondary sources.

GRADING SYSTEM/ASSESSMENT:

30% daily work assignments. Expect 2 assignments a week. The first will be questions based on the lesson for that week. 5pts. The second will be a project or assignment that we'll perform for the remainder of that week. 20pts per an assignment for 25 pts per week total (subject to change due to activities and/or holidays).

30% quizzes. 2 quizzes per quarter. It will begin with 4 multiple choice questions. Answer all 4 for 1pt each. After that there are 10 short essay questions. Each question will require a 3-4 sentence response. Students only need to answer 7 of the 10 questions. Each question is worth 3pts. 25pts per quiz total. In addition there

will be two essays per quarter. One essay will be a research essay that we will outline and write over the course of two weeks. The second will be an essay that we will write in class over a single 45 minute period. Each essay is 20pts.

30% quarter exam. The exam will have 10 multiple choice questions. Answer all 10 for 1pt each. After that there are 20 short essay questions. Each question will require a 3-4 sentence response. Students only need to answer 15 of the 20 questions. Each question is worth 5pts. 85pts total.

10% deportment. Deportment is based on class participation, behavior, and attitude.
