

Recycling




Dear Garfield,


on the floor...

What went well: I could make the sentences in a interesting way. For example, instead of saying happy, I could make a sentence "It makes me smiling".


What I could improve: Mayhr I can use a interesting adjective of colors to describe some seasons.






Science Fair Feedback by Grade 4


Group 2: Cash, Eric, Lechi, and Reuben

Zoe: I liked the 3rd grade's project. They studied slime and prepared things for making slime. They used toothpaste and water color and a bowl, spoon, and glitter.




Group 4: Jackson, Lindsay, Abhi, and Ritsu


